This month we are resurrecting some previously featured parts. From top to bottom: First, some brass strainers that have been dip soldered. The tool used to form the snaking pattern of the strainer is one of a kind. The second picture shows a machined housing. What started as a 99 lb billet of aluminum left our shop 85 lbs lighter and with a lot more holes in it. Next up is another machined aluminum part. This part was produced from a customer supplied sample that had originally been made from plastic. Finally we have a robotic arm used to dry endoscopes once they've been sterilized. An actuator hidden inside the housing gives this arm 90° of rotation at the flip of a switch.
