This month's featured part is 2.44" x 1.16", or if you're measuring in US Quarters it would be 2.55 x 1.24. The part shown is made from .012" thick 110 Copper. The US Quarter shown is .069" thick, and made from 91.67% copper. The first stop in our shop for this part is the laser. After that it is deburred and then formed. Given that 110 Copper is very soft, each part is handled with care throughout the processes, and inspected to be within the .002" flatness requirement before shipping.
